SAME-DAY NOTIFICATION OF UNEXPLAINED STUDENT ABSENCES

Contact details

There are times when we will need to contact you, including on the day if your child is absent and you haven't informed the school as to why. Do we have your most up to date contact details?

If not, please contact the school on <u>9546 0044 or email to office@sanoblepark.catholic.edu.au</u> so we can update our records. Please include parent/carers' name, address, phone numbers, email address and emergency contact details. Please remember to contact the school if any of these details or your circumstances change.

New Attendance Requirements

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify the school as soon as possible **on the day of absence**, by **EMAIL OR PHONE**. Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government and Catholic schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

The **St Anthony's** Attendance Policy which outlines the school's processes and procedures for monitoring, recording and following-up of student absences will be available in the next newsletter.

Please remember that attendance at school is a requirement. If your child is sick or unable to attend for any reason you need to call the school admin on 95460044 or email the school administration at:
















Jn 6:24-35

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John *Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never thirst.* In the Gospel this week, Jesus urges those he fed to reflect on their hunger and to work for food that will last forever - *the Bread of Life.* (John 6:24-35). When we use this expression it reminds us that just as food can satisfy our bodily hungers there are other hungers that will be satisfied in our life if we turn to Jesus. These may include deep longings for peace, happiness and meaning in life. What we need to do is place our trust and confidence in the Word and to remember that Jesus will not fail us. Jesus is God's gift, who not only can satisfy all our longings, but also brings eternal life to us. In all of these ways Jesus is our true Bread of Life who reaches out to us to offer true and lasting life.



Escaping Egypt, Moses led the Israelites through the desert. Food was very scarce and they were very hungry. Moses took the needs of the people to God who gave them food. We learn from the Bible the manna sent down from heaven was like small pale yellowish white coriander seeds. The people would gather the seeds and grind them with olive oil to make a flat bread. Jesus helps the people understand the manna was given to them by God and that he is greater than any earthly nourishment

of the Old Testament story. He urges them not to work for physical nourishment, as that food cannot last, but to work for food that endures for eternal life. Jesus, the Bread of Life, is that food that provides all our needs.

The challenge for us is to put our faith in Jesus: 'For he who comes to me will never be hungry and he who believes in me will never thirst.' Jesus is the bread from heaven and through our faith in him, we are fed and nourished to eternal life.



O God, you have never failed your people in their needs. Just as you gave Moses and the Israelites manna to eat in the desert, may our generous hands feed those who are hungry in our world today. Sustain our faith and hope in you and may we share your love with all those we meet. Loving God through this bread which gives us life may we be life for one another as we follow your Son. We ask this prayer through Jesus, our Lord.
